

Art and Culture of England: JTerm 2012

Intro to Art, Politics, and Theatre of England.

Study-Tour Leaders: Alan Garfield, CGIM Amy Ressler, Fine and Performing Arts.

>> **Cost of the study trip: \$1985. 20 Seats. First come basis.** <<

This short-term study abroad program requires participation in the class (Art 368 or UDTH 368) and the travel portion from January 10 - 18. You must be registered in the class (3 credits) in order to participate in the short-term study-trip.

Highlights of the 9 Day Travel Portion:

Day 1 – (Tuesday) Jan 10: Travel day. Depart Dubuque-Chicago for London on British Airways.

Day 2 – (Wednesday) Jan 11: London. Walking Tour of London. British Museum, Elgin Marbles from Parthenon. Bloomsbury writers and authors.

Day 3 – (Thursday) Jan 12: London. Hop-on/off Bus. Tower of London, Shakespeare's Globe Theatre.

Day 4 – (Friday) Jan 13: London. National Gallery. Afternoon free. Evening West End play.

Day 5 – (Saturday) Jan 14: London. Stonehenge and Bath. Jane Austen.

Day 6 – (Sunday) Jan 15: London. Service St. Martin in the Fields. Afternoon free. Evening West End musical.

Day 7 – (Monday) Jan 16: London. National Library. Open choice on play.

Day 8 – (Tuesday) Jan 17: Canterbury. Cathedral and old village tour. Group dinner and evening play.

Day 9 – (Wednesday) Jan 18: Canterbury to London to Chicago to Dubuque. Final meeting of class Thursday. Then rest over the weekend for Spring Semester to start on Monday.

All air and land transportation, hotel/bed and breakfast, tours, breakfasts, 2 dinners and 3 plays are included.

Deadlines:

1. Deposit:

Non-refundable deposit of \$400 (applied to total cost of \$1985) is due no later than May 4, 2011. Please pay via check or credit card at Student Accounts Office, Myers Teaching Center Rm 337, x3208.

2. Passport:

Begin your application now. You will need a passport application, 2 passport pictures, and an official birth certificate. You should process this (usually at a federal post office) immediately. Make no mistake, without a passport you will not be able to leave the country. The current fee for a new passport is \$110. A renewal is less. If you have a passport, but it will expire sometime in 2012, please renew it now.

3. PLEASE NOTE: Payment Schedule:

You need to make the payments ON TIME. Failure to do so will result in cancellation of your trip and loss of any funds already deposited.

- \$ 400 non-refundable deposit due May 4, 2011.

- \$ 1585 payment due on or before October 14, 2011 (Friday). If you require financial aid, please visit Tim Kremer in Myers Teaching Center before you leave for summer break.

Here is the refund policy for the \$1585.

a. If the refund request comes between Oct 14 – Oct 28, 2011 > 50% refundable of the \$1585.

b. If the refund request comes between Oct 29 – Nov 18, 2011 > 10% refundable of the \$1585.

c. If the refund request comes after Nov 19, 2011 > 0% refundable of the \$1585.

To be eligible for a refund according to the above schedule, you must give a written letter (signed) requesting a refund by the date indicated to Alan Garfield, Tech 224. Alternative forms of request, such as telephone or e-mail, are not valid.

4. APPROPRIATE CONDUCT AND ATTITUDE:

This is a university-sponsored study and travel program. As such, you must participate fully in the class and study-trip program. You are required to respect the supervision and authority of the director(s) of the program, and abide by the rules and regulations of the University of Dubuque and, in addition, those established for the program by the director(s).
